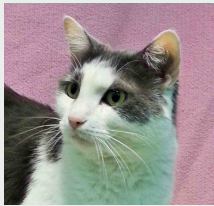

Spay Now or Stay Stupid

In honor of the national program, Spay Day USA, the shelter is again offering our own Spay Now or Stay Stupid surgery day. This program is available to qualifying Floyd County pet owners. If it's free, why wouldn't you do it?

We have been offering low cost spay neuter programs since 2008, and have altered over 1600 animals in our Fix Your Criiter Program. While the surgeries are usually reduced, there is still a minimal cost to pet owners.

Spay Now or Stay Stupid is a day that puts the focus on the importance of altering pets, and may enable us to attract owners that we've missed through special advertising. The surgeries actual cost will be on average \$51 per surgery. This fee will be covered by special donors. We have one major sponsor, but still need additional funding. 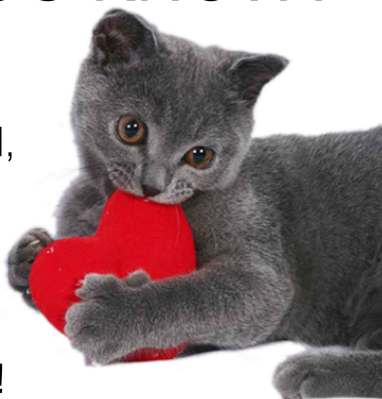
10. Did I mention dogs don't talk?

Indiana's Voices For The Animal Day

Every year, the national ASPCA and the Humane Society of the United States organize Animal Rights Activists to speak to our state government officials on behalf of humane legislation bills being submitted for law. This year H.B. 1201 passed out of the Indiana House of Representatives and is up for consideration by the Indiana Senate.

An estimated 125,000 animals end up in Indiana's shelters each year—and tens of

thousands of these otherwise healthy and adoptable pets must be euthanized simply because there aren't enough homes for them. This is a heartbreaking fate that can be avoided, but we need your help.

Your state senator is considering critical legislation (H.B. 1201) that would help solve Indiana's pet homelessness problem by requiring shelters to spay/neuter dogs and cats before adoption.

This bill has already passed the Indiana House of

Representatives. We urgently need your voice to make sure it passes the Senate, too.

What You Can Do

It is imperative that your state senator hear from you on this issue if it is to become law.

Please visit the ASPCA Advocacy Center now to contact your state senator in Indianapolis and urge him or her to support this humane, lifesaving measure.

Update Your Pet's Microchip!

Microchips can be your pets best chance at being reunited with you if he gets lost or separated. But a microchip is only as good as the information that is attached to it!

If you have moved or changed a phone number, did you contact your microchip company? Are you still on good terms with your emergency contact? These are all things to consider in assessing the accuracy of your pet's

microchip information.

To update your pet's information, you will need your pet's microchip number and the contact information for the company the chip was made by or registered with.

We have included with this article a list of the major microchip companies and their contact numbers. If you need your pet's number, have its microchip scanned!

Happy Tails: Tyrion

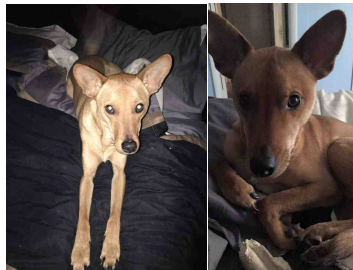
When I think about how Tyrion came in our lives, my heart overflows with joy. Knowing someone purposely threw him away when he was a puppy breaks my heart at the same time.
